40th Annual Spring Clean Up Day

Mark your calendars for April 1st! Nooksack Valley Disposal is sponsoring a Spring clean-up day, Saturday, April 1 from 9:00 a.m. until 12:00 p.m., located behind City Hall.

Nooksack Valley Disposal staff will be available to help residents unload their bulky items, appliances, furniture, scrap metal, and branches behind City Hall.

There will be a charge to cover the cost of disposal.

the Library Express are 6:00 AM – 11:00 PM daily.
