Routine Passport Processing Times = 10-13 weeks + mailing times

Expedited Passport Processing Times (additional \$60) = 7-9 weeks + mailing times

Dear Residents,

We hope this newsletter finds you well. We want to provide you with an update on the various projects that are currently underway in our community in collaboration with FEMA. These projects are aimed at addressing the aftermath of the disasters that were listed with FEMA, and we understand that many of you have questions and concerns regarding their progress. Here are some key points regarding the ongoing projects:

Number of Projects: To date, there are more than 76 projects that have been identified and listed with FEMA as disaster-related initiatives. Each of these projects is unique in its scope and complexity, encompassing a wide range of issues stemming from the disasters.

Project Structure: Within the umbrella of these 76 main projects, there are multiple sub-projects that have been defined to ensure a comprehensive approach to recovery. These sub-projects address specific aspects of our infrastructure, such as power, water, sewer systems, storm lines, as well as roads and sidewalks.

Infrastructure Repair: A significant portion of the listed projects pertains to repairing and restoring our community's vital infrastructure. This includes projects focused on power restoration, water system rehabilitation, sewer system repairs, storm line reconstruction, and road and sidewalk restoration. We understand that these aspects play a crucial role in your day-to-day lives, and we are committed to ensuring their recovery.

Visible Progress: We acknowledge that it can be challenging to witness the progress of projects that are primarily taking place underground or behind the scenes. We want to reassure you that despite the lack of visible changes, extensive work is happening to restore our community's functionality and aesthetics.

Timelines and Updates: We understand that many of you are curious about timelines for specific projects, especially those that directly impact your daily routines, such as road and bridge repairs. We are actively working on providing clearer timelines and progress updates.

Upcoming Projects:

- **Hovel Road:** Construction is expected to commence after the design and permitting phases, with an estimated start date in late 2025.
- **Multiple Roads:** We are aiming to begin construction on various roads by the end of 2025. We are also exploring the possibility of obtaining temporary patches for severely affected areas, such as Gough St and the sidewalk by the Post Office.

Environmental Restoration: We are also working in close partnership with the Sumas Water Improvement District to address environmental concerns. This includes the removal of debris from our streams and the Sumas River, ensuring the long-term health of these vital natural resources.


