Here's what's happening in Sumas over the next couple of months.

UTILITY BILLING

Sewer averages have ended with the October billing cycle.

The November bills (bills issued in December) will reflect sewer charges based on your actual water usage. This will continue each month through the March bill cycle.

This is a good time to keep a close eye on your water consumption. Often this is the time of year when water leaks are discovered, as high water usage will drastically affect your sewer charges, and the high water use due to a leak may have been missed during the summer months.

If you notice your water consumption has a sudden increase, you may have a water leak. Anything from leaking faucets, running toilets and larger leaks can greatly affect your sewer bill.

WINTER CITY MAINTENANCE

Sumas Public Works will continue to work to maintain City property and rights-of-way to ensure our City is prepared for the coming Winter weather.

VOYENT ALERT! AND WINTER WEATHER

Sumas uses the Voyent Alert! service to keep you informed during times of crisis and for day-to-day notices.

You can download the VoyentAlert! app, or register online to receive email, voice, or text based alerts at register.voyent-alert.us.

The City closely monitors the weather and Nooksack river gauges. We will only send Voyent Alert! notices related to weather or flooding when there is action that needs to be taken within our community.

Voyent Aert! is also used for road closures and utility related notices.

PREPARE FOR

FALL FREEZING



THE SEASON IS CHANGING. LATE FALL BRINGS FREEZING TEMPERATURES AND THE POTENTIAL FOR FROZEN PIPES.



INSULATE OUTDOOR SPIGOTS

You can be proactive and prepare for fall freezing by insulating your outdoor spigots. Spigot protectors can be found at most hardware or home and garden stores. These are easy to install and can protect your home from frozen and bursting pipes and the expensive water bills and fixes that come afterward.

DRAIN HOSES & IRRIGATION PIPES

You can be proactive and prepare for fall freezing by draining all your hoses and irrigation pipes/lines. Draining your hoses and irrigation lines takes a little bit of work upfront but can help you save on costly damages caused by ice.

INSULATE EXPOSED PIPES

You can be proactive and prepare for fall freezing by insulating your exposed pipes both outdoors and indoors. Heat tape or pipe wrapping can be found at most hardware or home and garden stores. Pipe insulation is usually easy to install and can protect your home from frozen and bursting pipes and the expensive water bills and fixes that come afterward.

SHOVEL

If your pipes do burst or freeze, one of the first steps in protecting your home from this is to use a home shut-off valve, if you have one. Having a shovel handy is important for digging out frozen pipes or home shut-off valves. Plus, it may come in handy for accessing other important household areas.

Sumas Library event for adults in February 2025.


Upcoming Programs at Sumas Library




CHESS AND CHECKERS! An open program for chess players of all abilities to play one another! Wednesdays, 3:00 P.M. - 4:30 P.M.
