OUTDOOR BURNING

Sumas follows the Whatcom County Fire Marshal's burn restrictions for recreational fires.

Check on any burn restrictions before starting a recreational fire. Contact the Whatcom County Fire Marshal's Office at 360-778-5900 or visit their website at: http://www.whatcomcounty.us/FireMarshal.

Outdoor burning is always prohibited within City limits, except for recreational fires in designated fire pits, following the Fire Marshal's restrictions.



MOWING SEASON

Please maintain grass and weeds as per Sumas Municipal Code 8.32.

As we're all out mowing and working in yards, please be sure to clean up and dispose of yard waste properly. Keeping sidewalks and roads clear of grass.

City code allows for compost piles in city limits as long as it is covered or concealed as not to negatively impact the adjoining property. Dumping lawn clippings anywhere but your own property is considered littering and subject to a possible fine.

We encourage all artistic styles including drawing, painting, collage, comics and doodles. Because of copyright issues, no fan art, Al-generated art, or art based on other artists' work is allowed.

It's easy to submit. Upload your artwork on our website at wcls.org/whatcomics or drop off your work at any public library. Accepted artists receive a copy of the book to keep.
